afford to not go to work.

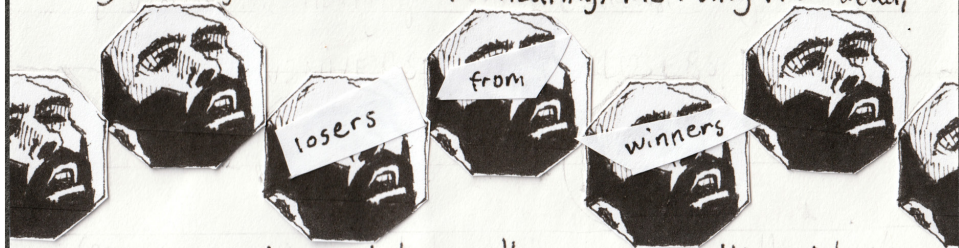

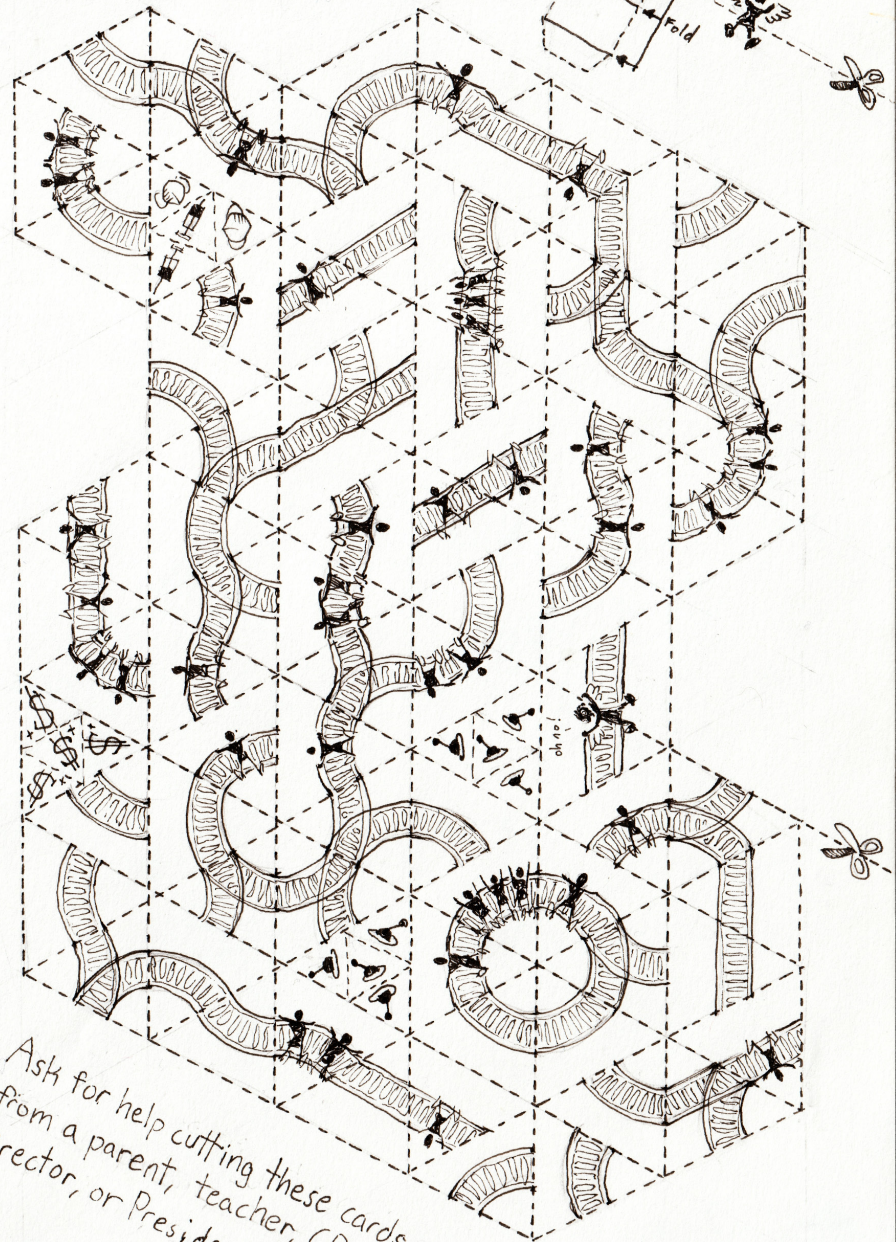
